Credentials: Requests for media credentials should be made at least five days in advance of the game date. They will be mailed if time permits; otherwise they will be left at the Bulldog Stadium Media Gate (located between the stadium and softball field). Interior space in the press box is extremely limited. Arrangements will be made to accommodate all working media in the best possible manner. **NO CREDENTIALS WILL BE ISSUED ON GAMEDAY!**

Press Area: The press box (including the roof) are restricted to working media representatives and others whose duties entail the use of the press area. No one will be seated without proper credentials. All media are expected to observe proper decorum in the press area at all times. Pre-Game notes, depth charts, game programs and halftime statistics will be provided in the press box. **Final stat packages may be picked up in the Sports Information Office (Room 124-B James Gymnasium) - 30 minutes after the game.**

Photography & Video: Working photo credentials are available to accredited media if requested in advance. Photographers and videographers may shoot along the sidelines and end lines but only in designated areas outside the team boxes per NCAA regulations.

Parking: Media parking is available just outside the gate of Bulldog Stadium.

Ticket Prices: \$13 General Admission, \$8 Seniors, Students w/ID and Youth and Children 6 and under are admitted free (Note: Ticket regulations are subject to change). DR. MICKEY L. BURNIM - PRESIDENT



Dr. Mickey L. Burnim, a native of Teague, Texas, is the ninth President of Bowie State University in Bowie, Maryland. Prior to arriving at Bowie State University, Dr. Burnim served as chancellor of Elizabeth City (NC) State University (ECSU) and was the eighth chief executive officer of ECSU.

Dr. Burnim ushered in an era of qualitative improvement and growth at Elizabeth City State University. He has led the development of a comprehensive strategic plan; initiated new business, civic and educational partnerships; established the university's first two endowed professorships; led in the establishment of the university's first three master's degree programs in elementary education, biology, and mathematics; implemented several new baccalaureate degree programs, including marine environmental science, social work, communication studies, graphic design, aviation science, and pharmaceutical science. In fall 2005, under his leadership, Elizabeth City State University implemented a joint pharmacy program in partnership with the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill. Dr. Burnim has also led the development of a campus computer network, and has established strong fiscal integrity.

To improve operational efficiency, Dr. Burnim is credited for having reorganized the university into four schools: Arts and Humanities; Business and Economics; Education and Psychology; and Mathematics, Science, and Technology. Additionally, he has directed the development of a comprehensive enrollment management and marketing plan, which, in fall 2005, yielded for the third consecutive year the highest enrollment in the university's history. In 2001, he began the oversight of the largest construction and renovation project (\$46.3 million) ever undertaken at ECSU, including the construction of a physical education/fieldhouse facility, a student center, and a new residence hall. In 2004, he celebrated the opening of the university's first privatized student housing facility.

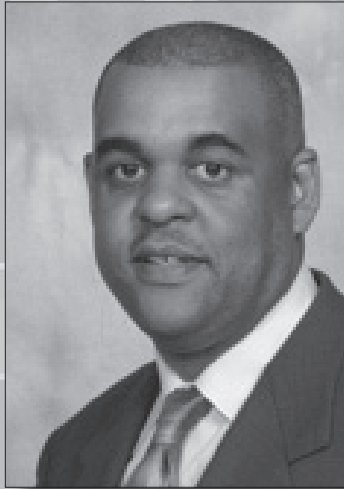
Dr. Burnim is an economist having earned three degrees in economics — a Bachelor of Arts degree and a Master of Arts degree from The University of North Texas, and a Ph.D. from The University of Wisconsin at Madison. His fields of specialization are public finance and labor economics. Dr. Burnim has written papers and published several scholarly articles in these areas.

Prior to joining Elizabeth City State University, Dr. Burnim served as Provost and Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs at North Carolina Central University. Earlier in his career, he worked as Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs in the General Administration of The University of North Carolina; as a staff economist at the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; and as a faculty member and researcher at The Florida State University.

Dr. Burnim serves on several local boards, including the Elizabeth City branch of the Wachovia Advisory Board, Elizabeth City Chamber of Commerce, Elizabeth City Rotary Club, Salvation Army, and Albemarle Economic Development Commission. Nationally, he serves on the NAFEO Board of Directors, the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) Board of Directors, the American Council on Education – Commission on Advancement of Racial and Ethnic Equity, and the System and Computer Technology (SCT) Executive Advisory Council. Recently, he accepted an appointment from Executive Council of the Commission on Colleges to serve on the Principles Review Committee, which is charged to study the Commission's current standards. Dr. Burnim is the immediate past chairman of the Board of Directors for the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA).

Dr. Burnim and his wife, the former LaVera Levels, have two adult children and two grandchildren.

DEREK CARTER - ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



The 2007-2008 year will mark the fifth year for Derek Carter to serve as Director of Athletics at Bowie State University. While overseeing all internal and external operations of the Department of Athletics, Carter's vision of total student-athlete development is being developed. With the implementation of the NCAA Champs/Life Skills program, expanding the athletic department staff, upgrading the athletic website, and maintaining an athletic championship mentality, Bowie State athletics continues to thrive within the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA).

A Washington, DC native and graduate of DeMatha High School, Carter brings over fifteen years on intercollegiate athletic experience to Bowie State University. Prior to his arrival at BSU, Carter served as Athletic Director at Virginia State University, Assistant Athletic Director at Virginia Tech, Assistant Director of Student Life at The University of Tennessee, and Athletic Director at Patrick Henry High School, Ashland, VA. He also spent three years as a marketing/account representative at The Xerox Corporation.

He earned his B.S. in Marketing Education from Virginia Tech where he was also a four year letter winner in football. In addition, he earned a M.S. in Sport Management from The University of Tennessee/Knoxville. Carter is also a 1997 graduate of the Sports Management Institute's Executive Program.

Carter and his wife Karen (BSU '86) are the proud parents of Bryce (6) and Cole (2).

DONNA POLK - ASSOCIATE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR/COMPLIANCE



Donna Polk joined the Bowie State University family in October 2005 as the Associate Athletic Director/Compliance Coordinator. Prior to joining BSU, Polk served as the Director of Compliance and Sports Information Director at Columbia Union College from 2002-2004.

Polk's athletic experience includes stints as Head Women's Basketball Coach (Columbia Union College) and Head Girl's Junior Varsity and Varsity Coach at Bowie High School. The Harbeson, Delaware native played four seasons for the Lady Pioneers of Columbia Union basketball team (1987-1991) and is a member of the 1,000 point club.

Polk earned a B.S. in Counseling Psychology from Columbia Union and earned a M.A. degree in Organizational Management from the University of Phoenix.

ATHLETIC ADMINISTRATION

GREGORY C. GOINGS - SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR

Gregory C. Goings begins his fifth year as the Bowie State University Sports Information Director. A native of Washington, D.C. and graduate of Virginia State University, he has over 16 years experience in the field of collegiate sports information.

Prior to joining the BSU family, he was a Sales Associate with Chevy Chase Bank (2001 - 2003). His athletic experience began in 1988 at Virginia State University as their Sports Information Director, a position he held until October 2000. The Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) and the CIAA Sports Information Directors Association selected him as Sports Information Director of the Year in 1993 - 1994 and again in 1995 - 1996. In the summer of 1995, he was selected as a Press Officer for the United States Olympic Festival in Denver, Colorado. Additionally, he also served as official scorer for Reviving Baseball in the Inner Cities (RBI) World Series in Cleveland, Denver and Orlando. One other interesting fact, is that he also finds time to officiate collegiate and high school basketball, something he has done for the past 23 years.

In addition to his athletic experience, he was the host of the #1 rated (Arbitron) night time radio program (The Quiet Storm) on WCDX - Power 93 FM (1988 - 93), served as an air personality for Virginia State University's public broadcasting radio station - WVST and for WPLZ - Magic 99 FM (1984 - 1986).

Goings is a member of the College Sports Information Directors Association (CoSIDA), Black College Sports Information Directors Association (BCSIDA), Second Vice President of the Division II Sports Information Directors Association and Secretary of the CIAA Sports Information Directors Association. Mr. Goings is a past president of the CIAA Sports Information Directors Association, former member of the Harlon Hill Division II Football Player-of-the-Year Advisory Committee and is a life member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated.

He is a 1977 graduate of McKinley Tech High School and is currently pursuing a Masters in Sports Management at the United States Sports Academy. Mr. Goings and his wife Dr. Donna Powell-Goings reside in Beltsville and he has one daughter, Shannen (16).

Lynn joined the Bulldogs family after serving as Director of Football Operations and Assistant Coach (Offensive Line) at Morgan State University (2002 - 2004). He has also served as Morgan State's Interim Head Football Coach (November 2001 - February 2002), Assistant Head Football Coach (January 2000 - November 2001) and Defensive Line Coach (April 1999 - January 2000).

Lynn began his coaching career at Suitland High School (Forestville, MD) where he served as Assistant Football Coach (1996 - 1999) and Head Wrestling Coach (1995 - 2000). He played his college football at Morgan State, where he lettered all four years as offensive guard.

Lynn, graduated from Morgan State in 1990 with a degree in political science. He and his wife Gayle, are the parents of two children; daughter Briana (13) and son Michael, III (8) and reside in Ft. Washington, MD.

MICHAEL CARTER ASST. HEAD COACH / OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR



Michael Carter begins his fourth season on the Bowie State University football staff. Prior to joining the Bulldogs, Carter served as tight ends coach at Morgan State University (1999 - 2001). Carter also served as an assistant varsity coach and Defensive Coordinator at Overlea High School (2002 - 2003).

Carter believes that calling the right play at the right time can certainly make the difference in a game, but a total commitment to excellence, player preparation and a proven game plan are the keys to a successful season.

Carter, a 1987 graduate of Morgan State University, holds a B.S. degree in Telecommunications and was a four year letterman in football. A native of Richmond, Virginia, Carter and his wife Patt, have two children, Janae and Michael, Jr. and reside in Baltimore, Maryland.



DARONTE' JONES DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR, DEFENSIVE BACKS & PRO LIASON



Daronte' Jones enters his third season as Bowie State's Defensive Coordinator. In addition to coordinating the Bulldog defense, Jones also serves as the Pro Liaison.

Since his arrival in 2005, the defense has captured an aggressive, attacking scheme that has gained the Bulldogs high recognition, both at the conference and national levels. Under his tutelage, the Bowie State defense has ranked in the Top 10 nationally in five statistical categories (total defense, scoring defense, pass efficiency, pass sacks and rushing defense, including 3rd or higher in total defense) both years. Under Coach Jones' watch, five defensive players have been named All-CIAA, one of which went on to become a D2football.com All-American.

Prior to his arrival at BSU, Jones served as the assistant football coach and defensive coordinator at Jeanerette (LA) Senior High School (2004) and assistant coach and physical education teacher at Franklin (LA) Senior High School (2003-2004). He has also served as assistant football coach/defensive backs at Nicholls State University (2002-2003) and defensive graduate assistant at Lenoir-Rhyne College (2001-2002).

A native of Capitol Heights, Md., Jones earned a bachelor's in 2001 from Morgan State University. He is a member of the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Incorporated.



DAMON WILSON SPECIAL TEAMS / RUNNING BACKS



Coach Wilson returns to the Bulldogs sideline after serving three seasons as as assistant for the Tigers of Texas Southern University. During Wilson's previous BSU tenure (1999-2003), he served in several capacities including Special Teams Coordinator to Assistant Head Coach. Under his watch, the BSU special teams always ranked at the top of the conference in many categories. Wilson was also responsible for recruiting potential student-athletes.

Wilson played tight end for Bowie State (1997-1998) and earned First Team All-CIAA honors. The Washington, DC native, received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Bowie State in 2000. He is a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Incorporated and enjoys working with kids, fishing and attending sporting events.

LESTER OVERTON

OFFENSIVE LINE / RECRUITING COORDINATOR



Coach Overton enters his fourth season with Bowie State University and has over 14 years of coaching experience. Lester began his coaching career at the Oxon Hill Boys & Girls Club (1991 - 1994). Coach Overton then went on to coach at Suitland High School (1994 - 1999), serving as Offensive Line and Special Teams Coordinator, Recruiting Coordinator and his final year there as the Offensive Coordinator. Suitland was State Finalist in 1997 and 1998. Coach Overton has coached the last five years at Eleanor Roosevelt High School serving as the Assistant Head Coach and Offensive Line Coach. Lester served as the Offensive Coordinator for the 2003 P.G. County All-Star football game. He has coached all 14 years along side his brother Laurence. Coach Overton is currently employed full-time with the Department of Navy as a Computer Specialist.

Overton earned a B.S. in Computer Science from Salisbury (MD) State University (1991) where he played offensive guard and has a M.S. from the University of Maryland University College (2000). He resides in Clinton (MD) with his wife Michelle and son Lester, Jr.

Coach Smith enters his fourth season with the Bulldogs football program. Theron began his coaching career in 1994, as a Junior Varsity Assistant Football Coach and Offensive Coordinator at Potomac High School (Oxon Hill, MD). From there, Coach Smith went on to serve as Wide Receiver/Defensive Backs coach Surrattsville High School (Clinton, MD). During that same period, Smith was an assistant basketball coach (Varsity and Junior Varsity) also at Potomac. Before joining the collegiate ranks, Smith was a Secondary Math teacher at Potomac High School from 1994 - 2001.

Smith is currently employed full-time at the Washington Navy Yard serving as a Video Telecommunications Coordinator. The Prince George's County native received his B.S. degree in Accounting from North Carolina A&T State University (1993).

He then moved on to coach at Suitland High School (1994 - 1999), serving as a Defensive Coordinator and Defensive Backs coach. Suitland was a State Finalist in 1997 and 1998. Coach Overton has coached the last 4 years at Eleanor Roosevelt High School serving as a Defensive Coordinator, Linebackers coach and Defensive Backs coach. Laurence has coached on six Prince George's County (MD) Championship teams, three Maryland State Runner-Up teams and served as the Defensive Coordinator for the 2001 P.G. County All-Star football game.

Coach Overton attended Cheyney University (1983 - 1985), where he started two years at Free Safety. He also attended Alabama A&M University from 1986 - 1988. Coach Overton is the brother of Bowie State Offensive Line coach Lester Overton.

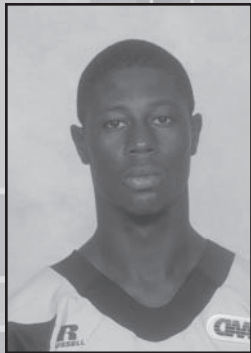
BOWIE STATE BULLDOGS 2007 OUTLOOK

"Expect To Win" will be the theme used by the Bowie State University football team during "Expect to Win" will be the theme used by the Bowie State University football team for the 2007 season. "Since arriving back in 2004 and through last season, our philosophy has been and will be the same," said fourth year head coach Mike Lynn. "We expect to win every game, to win the conference championship and expect to compete for the national championship."

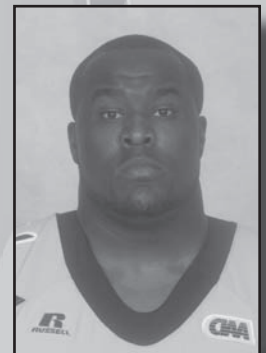
In terms of the Bulldogs schedule, Bowie State will face three new teams for the first time in Glenville (WV) State University (8/23) and Newberry (SC) College (9/8) on the road and host Slippery Rock (PA) University (9/15). Bowie State will begin conference play in week four on the road at Fayetteville State (9/22) followed by back-to-back home games against Saint Paul's (9/29) and Livingstone (10/6). BSU's Bulldogs will then hit the road for divisional games versus Virginia State (10/13) and Virginia Union (10/20) before returning home to face Shaw (10/27) for Homecoming. Bowie State will close out the regular season against the defending CIAA Eastern Division champions of Elizabeth City State (11/3).

Bowie State wrapped up last season with a 5-5 overall record and 3-4 in the CIAA East. Statistically, Bowie State ranked 3rd in NCAA Total Defense (226.1), 4th in NCAA Rushing Yards per Game (121.2) and 9th in NCAA Total Pass Sacks (2.9). The Bulldogs led the CIAA in Scoring Defense (12.0) and Time of Possession (32:24). Former Bulldog Nathaniel Queen set a BSU single game rushing yards record (vs. Virginia Union) with 213 yards and ended last season as the top ground gainer in the CIAA and ranked 11th in NCAA Rushing Yards Per Game (121.2).

The offense will return a solid core of players which include eight starters that should put the Bulldogs in a good competitive position. A key to BSU's offense starts up front with seniors Jerrick Jeffreys (6-3, 310) and Cordell Hawkins (6-4, 336). Bowie State must fill the quarterback position with Lamar Manigo ending his career as the Bulldogs all-time leader in touchdown passes thrown in a season (17) and career (36). Junior Larry Dixon (5-11, 170) along with sophomores Anthony Green (6-5, 220) and Brandon McDonald (6-3, 176) are top returning receivers.

In the defensive scheme of things, tradition tells Coach Lynn and his staff that defense has always been good and really don't see that changing. According to Coach Lynn, highlighting players on defense would be extremely difficult but the unit itself is strong.

Many of Bowie State's top recruits came from one high school (Edmondson) in Baltimore. Kyle Jackson (6-2, 220, LB), Tariq Jones (5-9, 175, RB) and Jonathan Mason (6-3, 300, OL) should be major contributors to the Bulldogs program. Lynn says, "The reason we're so high on these guys is because they won the state championship as a team and as a family. We wanted to bring guys, outside of the talent and the mindset that expect to win, know how to win and guys that will work hard."

BOWIE STATE HISTORY

Bowie State University is an outgrowth of the first school opened in Baltimore, Maryland, on January 9, 1865, by the Baltimore Association for the Moral and Educational Improvement of Colored People, which was organized on November 28, 1864, to engage in its self-appointed mission on a statewide basis. The first normal school classes sponsored by the Baltimore Association were held in the African Baptist Church, located on the corner of Calvert and Saratoga streets. In 1868, with the aid of a grant from the Freedmen's Bureau, the Baltimore Association purchased from the Society of Friends a building at Courtland and Saratoga streets for the relocation of its normal school until 1883, when it was reorganized solely as a normal school to train Negro teachers.

The Baltimore Normal School had received occasional financial support from the city of Baltimore since 1870 and from the State since 1872. In 1871, it received a legacy from the Nelson Wells Fund. This fund, established before Wells' death in February 1843, provided for the education of freed Negro children in the State of Maryland. On April 8, 1908, at the request of the Baltimore Normal School, which desired permanent status and funding as an institution for the education of Negro teachers, the State Legislature authorized its Board of Education to assume control of the school. The same law re-designated the institution as Normal School No. 3. Subsequently, it was relocated on a 187-acre tract in Prince George's County, and by 1914 it was known as the Maryland Normal and Industrial School at Bowie. A two-year professional curriculum in teacher education, which started in 1925, was expanded to a three-year program. In 1935, a four-year program for training of elementary school teachers began, and the school was renamed Maryland State Teachers College at Bowie. In 1951, with the approval of the State Board of Education, its governing body, Bowie State expanded its program to train teachers for junior high schools. Ten years later, permission was granted to institute a teacher-training program for secondary education. In 1963, a liberal arts program was started and the name was changed to Bowie State College.

In 1970, Bowie State College was authorized to grant its first graduate degree, the Master of Education. A significant milestone in the development of graduate studies at Bowie State College was achieved with the Board of Trustees' approval of the establishment of the Adler-Dreikurs Institute of Human Relations in 1975. On July 1, 1988, Bowie State College officially became Bowie State University, a change reflecting significant growth in the Institution's programs, enrollment, and service to the area. On

that same day, the University also became one of 11 constituent institutions of the newly-formed University System of Maryland.

Bowie State University, in 1995, won an 11-year, \$27 million award from the national Aeronautics and Space Administration/ National Science Foundation to become one of only six nation Model Institutions for Excellence in science, engineering, and mathematics.

During 2001-2004, three state-of-the-art buildings, The Center for Learning and Technology, a \$21M high-tech building, the Computer Science Building, and The Christa McAuliffe Residential Community were completed.

As a charter member of NCATE, Bowie State became one of the first institutions in the country to receive accreditation by NCATE in 1954 and since then has maintained that accreditation for 50 consecutive years. May 2005, the University graduated its first class of candidates who earned a Doctorate of Education in Education Leadership (Ed.D.) and the first class of four-year nursing students from the School of Professional Studies.

Currently the University offers a wide array of undergraduate and graduate degree programs. Bowie State University continues to make strides with the matriculation of more than 5,500 undergraduate and graduate students; and remains among the top five producers nationally of African Americans earning master's degrees in technology, science and mathematics. Of the University's 165 full-time faculty, more than 75 percent hold doctoral or terminal degrees in their fields of expertise.



THE CIAA

The Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association is the oldest African-American athletic conference in the United States. Founded in 1912 on the campus of Hampton Institute (now Hampton University), the CIAA embodies a history rich in tradition, which epitomizes the fortitude of its 11 colleges and universities.

When the conference was founded, it was originally known as the Colored Intercollegiate Athletic Association. Its founding fathers were Allen Washington and C.H. Williams of Hampton Institute; Ernest J. Marshall of Howard University; George Johnson of Lincoln University (PA); W.E. Atkins, Charles Fraser and H.P. Hargrove of Shaw University and J.W. Barco and J.W. Pierce of Virginia Union University.

Student-athletes who compete in CIAA sports this season, will continue a legacy of excellence that culminated in a competitive frenzy that began a half century ago. That culminating event was the first CIAA basketball tournament. Today, it is highly regarded as an NCAA model for sports promotion and sponsorship.

The first CIAA tournament was held at the end of the 1945-46 season in Turner's Arena in Washington, DC, where the North Carolina College men's team reined victorious over that inaugural tournament. Lem Graves, who chronicled the tournament events for a weekly newspaper, wrote that it was the "all-time sports thrill of a lifetime." His assertion remains true today.

The CIAA, which is composed of 10 member institutions: Bowie State University, Elizabeth City State University, Fayetteville State University, Johnson C. Smith University, Livingstone College, Saint Augustine's College, Saint Paul's College, Shaw University, Virginia State University and Virginia Union University, is divided into eastern and western divisions in all sports except baseball, and sponsors 16 annual championships. The men's championships are football, cross country, basketball, cross country, indoor track and field, golf and baseball. The women's championships are volleyball, cross country, indoor track and field, tennis, bowling, outdoor track and field and softball.

Most recently, Virginia Union University won the NCAA Division II men's basketball national titles in 2005, 1992, and 1980. CIAA basketball teams have appeared in the NCAA tournament in each of the last 28 years. The confer-

ence has distinguished itself by having more teams compete for the national basketball title than any other conference at the Division II level.

The CIAA represents the embodiment of quality in athletics. Not only does CIAA basketball rank amongst the top Division II conferences in the nation, it also celebrates some of the most revered football coaches who have ever taught the game. Coach Willard Bailey, currently at St. Paul's College is the CIAA's career coaching leader with 217 victories, and Herman "Ike" Boone, former Head Coach at T.C. Williams High School, who was portrayed by Denzel Washington in Disney's blockbuster movie "Remember the Titans," are two of the many coaches that have brought unparalleled value to the CIAA's efforts in providing student athletes with quality educational opportunities that will last a lifetime.

As the CIAA inches closer to 100 years of excellence in education and athletics, we continue to welcome growth and change; all with the confidence that the legacy of the CIAA will continue.
